## Modern technology as part of sustainable development

### Definition of **SUSTAINABILITY**:

- The essence was articulated by the Brundtland Commission, tasked by the UN in 1987 to formulate a global agenda for change: "Sustainable development is development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."
- This driving principle was embraced by all nations when the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were adopted in 2015, forming a blueprint to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure peace and prosperity for all by 2030.
- ightarrow To contribute to achieving these goals, we are in need of a sustainability-minded legal profession, aware of needs for our digitalised and globalised world.

\*surveyed lawyers between 25 and 45 years old across 48 countries to measure the evolution of lawyers' perceptions towards the challenges affecting the future of the profession


